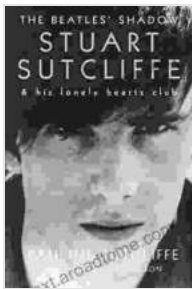


Stuart Sutcliffe: The Lost Beatle

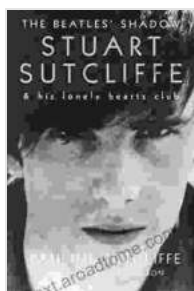

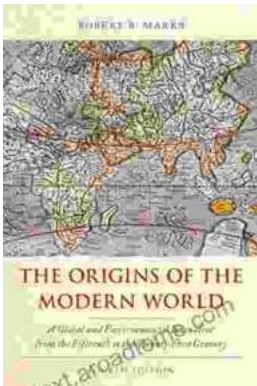
